Rhea was forced to give up her children, but she never stopped loving them and through her strength and courage was finally able to escape for the world of drugs and prostitution, and regain custody of her children. This is her remarkable story.

Finally, it places Dickens' works within a wider European artistic context through comparisons with Hugo, Tolstoy, Daumier and Grandville.
