Child Soldiers and Restorative Justice - Jean Chrysostome K. Kiyala

This book investigates how, while children used as soldiers are primarily perceived as victims of offences against international law, they also commit war atrocities. Attempts to prosecute child soldiers through the mainstream justice system have resulted in child rights abuses. Where no accountability measures have been taken, demobilised young soldiers have experienced rejection, and eventually, some have returned to soldiering. This research provides evidence of the potential of restorative justice peacemaking circles and locally-based jurisprudence - specifically the Baraza - to hold former child soldiers

accountable and facilitate their reintegration into society.
