Stress and Dissatisfaction in the Air Force's Remotely Piloted Aircraft Community - Chaitra M. Hardison 2017-06-16

The initial survey round was followed by a second one in 2014 and by a third in 2017. Compiled using nationally representative

surveys of more than 150,000 adults age 15 and above in over 140 economies, The Global Findex Database 2017: Measuring Financial Inclusion and the Fintech Revolution includes updated indicators on access to and use of formal and informal financial services.
