Dibs presents abnormal social behavior by continuously isolating himself, rarely speaking, and physically lashing out at those around

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him. When Axline first meets Dibs's parents, they describe her as their son's last hope. The book details the

interactions between Dibs and Axline and utilizes actual session transcripts for dialogue.
