Unless the mythoi of religion are translated into ritual or ethical compassionate action, they remain incomprehensible and opaque. Today we tend to read our scriptures with a literalism that is without parallel in the history of religion and this has made faith problematic for

many; in the past, for example, nobody understood the first chapter of Genesis as a literal account of the origins of life. Working and learning can be viewed as parallel processes, with the result that lifelong learning (LLL) must be considered as more than just a catch phrase within our society, it is an undisputed necessity. Today, we are facing a tremendous increase in educational technologies of all kinds and, although the influence of these new technologies is enormous, we must never forget that learning is

both a basic cognitive and a social process - and cannot be replaced by technology.
