Even after Christianity usurps the original Jewish notion of a second, younger God, certain post-biblical Jewish circles—in particular early Jewish mystical circles—maintained and revived it with the archangel "Metatron," a controversial figure whose very existence is questioned and fiercely debated by the rabbis of the Babylonian
