It owes much to the contributions of members of the language teaching profession across Europe and beyond. Les programmes définissent l'obligation de commencer « la langue vivante étrangère ou régionale » au CP, à raison de 54 heures par an, soit 1 h 30 par semaine, si possible réparties sur chacun des jours de la semaine. Les programmes de la maternelle recommandent également de familiariser les élèves avec les sonorités des autres langues (d'où l'attention également portée au cycle 1).
