Standardization: A Business Approach to the Role of National Standardization Organizations - Henk J. de Vries 2013-06-29

The first national standardization th organizations were founded in the early decades of the 20 century and were aimed at rationalizing industrial production. In many cases, formal standardization organizations are not the obvious bodies for developing standards to meet business needs. Is this inevitable or could they improve performance and regain their market share? Henk de Vries answers this question against the background of current developments in standardization at the international, European, and national levels.
