Resume: Cette etude a eu d'abord l'objectif de s'interroger sur la pertinence de transposer la notion francaise de verbe support au verbe arabe 'Akhadha (prendre) et sa variante Ittakhadha (prendre pour soi). Elle a ensuite defini, a partir d'un corpus classique et contemporain, les caracteristiques specifiques et les differents emplois de ce verbe en arabe classique et moderne. Notre recherche s'inscrit dans le cadre theorique et methodologique du Lexique-Grammaire de Maurice Gross et dans celui de la theorie de l'Analyse Matricielle Definitoire d'Amr Helmy Ibrahim. Apres avoir applique les tests de reconnaissance du verbe support a 'Akhadha/Ittakhadha, nous avons trouve environ 330 substantifs, repartis en 28 grandes listes distinctes, qui sont susceptibles d'acquiescer, dans des situations syntactico-semanticques plus ou moins contraintes, le statut de noms predicatifs actualises par 'Akhadha et Ittakhadha. Les resultats obtenus contribuent a l'objectif plus general de cette etude: la contribution a integrer les donnees linguistiques obtenus dans des systemes informatiques en vue de l'analyse automatique de ces noms."

**The Arabic Dialect of the Jews in Tripoli (Libya)** - Sumikazu Yoda 2005

The present study is a grammatical description of the Arabic dialect of the Jews of Tripoli (Libya). Jews in North Africa adopted Arabic as their native speech during the first (pre-Hilalian) period and their dialects therefore preserve archaic features no longer present in the dialects of their Muslim neighbours. The Jewish dialects are also distinguished by the use of many words of Hebrew and Aramaic origin. In Tripoli the difference between the Jewish and Muslim vernaculars manifests itself not only in the vocabulary but also in the language type: The Jewish dialect represents the sedentary type while the Muslim dialect belongs to the Bedouin type. After the immigration of Tripolitanian Jewry to Israel the use of the Arabic dialect has become reduced, and it is estimated that the youngest generation who can still speak it is in their forties. It is obvious, therefore, that in a few decades the Arabic dialect of the Jews of Tripoli, like other Judaeo-Arabic vernaculars, will cease to exist. The present study which also contains texts and a glossary may contribute to

preserving a vanishing Arabic dialect.

The necessity of studying Arabic dialects has attracted more attention in the recent years. Qatar University chose to support the growing academic interest and research in the field by hosting the Association Internationale de Dialectologie Arabe (AIDA) conference in 2013. The AIDA10 conference and the tenth volume of AIDA proceedings show that a good deal of change and development in the field is occurring. Fewer papers deal on hitherto unknown dialects as the white spots on the map of Arabic dialects have significantly shrunk. More papers focus on syntactical issues because we now possess more and larger text collections. Papers using "change" in their titles indicate that Arabic dialectology has a long history. The time has come to re-examine the studies of the 1940s, 50s, and 60s concerning the dialects of certain regions. This book includes twenty one essays with six written in French. 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*Etienne Fourmont, 1683-1745 - Cécile Leung 2002*

Fourmont was the first scholar in France to deal with Chinese matters. He started his career in the Academie des Inscriptions et Belles-Lettres as an Hebraist, but he left this discipline and turned to Chinese in 1711. At that time he met Arcadio Huang, a young French-speaking Chinese man in the Bibliotheque Nationale. Fourmont seized the opportunity to be introduced to Chinese. Huang taught him the pronunciation of Chinese syllables, and quite particularly, he introduced him to the 214 radicals. Fourmont's greatest feat was having 80,000 fine Chinese characters engraved in Paris for his many proposed dictionaries. He must have visited his engravers each day for many years to inspect and correct their work. The petits chinois, as these engravings were called, are still on display today at the imprimerie Nationale in Paris.

These foci and other subjects investigated, such as the syntactic studies and the presentation of recently gathered linguistic data, bear reference to the subtitle "Common Trends - Recent Developments - Diachronic Aspects".
