Research on medieval and early modern travel literature has made great progress, which now allows us to take the next step and to analyze the correlations between the individual and space throughout time, which contributed essentially to identity formation in many different settings. The contributors to this volume engage with a variety of pre-modern texts, images, and other documents related to travel and the individual's self-orientation in foreign lands and make an effort to determine the concept of identity within a spatial framework often determined by the meeting of various cultures. Moreover, objects, images and words can also travel and connect people from different worlds through books. The volume thus brings together new scholarship focused on the interrelationship of travel, space, time, and

individuality, which also includes, of course, women's movement through the larger world, whether in concrete terms or through proxy travel via readings. Travel here is also examined with respect to craftsmen's activities at various sites, artists' employment for many different projects all over Europe and elsewhere, and in terms of metaphysical experiences (catabasis).

No en balde este "discurso" va ordenado desde el desenlace de una "fabula" anclada en el deseo de "alcanzar algun tiempo libertad". En ese sentido, confortado por el conflictivo atalayismo aureo y la preceptiva del Pinciano relativa al "fin miserable del poema", la epopeya tragicomica de

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Guzman -mezcla menipea de "estilos" a la medida de la compleja psicología del personaje-rebasa con creces los confines del "género picaresco". A juzgar por la apasionada recepción de la obra por Quevedo, Cervantes y Gracian, et Guzman venia a ser un "libro" rupturista que marcaba un hito decisivo en la historia de la novela realista moderna.

La novela picaresca dejó de ser dominio exclusivo de protagonistas varones, cuando, en 1605, se publica *La pícara Justina*. Con ella se llega, en palabras de Alborg: a la plena aceptación de la mujer en el mundo de la picaresca, y supone un logro literario equivalente al que en su día presumió el *Lazarillo de Tormes* para la narrativa española del Siglo de Oro. Este hecho nos ha llevado a plantear la idoneidad de analizar detenidamente

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cuatro novelas del Barroco, cuya protagonista absoluta es una pícaro: La hija de Celestina (1612), de Salas Barbadillo, La niña de los embustes, Teresa de Manzanares (1632) y La Garduña de Sevilla y anzuelo de las bolsas (1642), ambas de Castillo Solórzano. El presente ensayo se propone estudiar las citadas novelas desde dos enfoques. Por un lado, el personaje de la pícaro; por otro, la función que realiza dentro del relato. La primera reflexión nos permitirá ahondar en el perfil psicológico de la pícaro: temperamento y características físico-morales: ¿cómo son?, ¿cómo piensan?, ¿cómo se comportan y por qué?, ¿cómo viven?, ¿cuál es su herencia genealógica?, ¿se enamoran?, ¿son seres insensibles?, etc. La segunda perspectiva, esto es, la función que desempeña la pícaro dentro del relato, descubrirá qué alteraciones sufre la poética picaresca cuando el protagonista es una mujer.

Is the pícaro, the roguish hero of early modern Spanish adventure fiction, a 'real man'? What position does he hold in the gender hierarchy of his fictional social context? Why is the pícaro so 'non-female'? What effect has her gender constitution on her fictional social context? In terms of a gendered subject, the picaresque figure has hardly been analyzed so far. Although scholars have recognized it as a transgressive and subversive model, the 'queer' effect of the figure is yet to be examined.
