The New Nuclear Disorder - Stephen J. Cimbala 2016-02-17

In the twenty-first century, the United States confronts an international system of great complexity and shifting security challenges. Among these challenges are those posed by nuclear weapons. Instead of becoming obsolete or being marginalized by the end of the Cold War and the

demise of the Soviet Union, nuclear weapons have become more important to present and future international stability and peace but the relationship is paradoxical. Studies of these efforts have identified new forms of work including emotion work, identity work, boundary work, strategy work, institutional

work, and a host of others. Missing in these conversations, however, is a recognition that these forms of work are all part of a broader phenomenon driven by historical shifts that began with modernity and dramatically accelerated through the twentieth century. This book introduces the social-symbolic work perspective, which addresses this broader phenomenon. The social-symbolic work perspective integrates diverse streams of research to examine how people purposefully and reflexively work to construct organizational life, including the identities, technologies, boundaries, and strategies that constitute their organizations.
